



Technical Definition

- The definition in the <u>Convention on Biodiversity</u> is the most wellused:
 - "Biological diversity means the variability among living organisms from all sources including, inter alia (among other things), terrestrial, marine, and other aquatic ecosystems and the ecological complexes of which they are a part; this includes diversity within species, between species, and within ecosystems"
- But what does that mean in practice?



Think of New York City...

- Cultures
- Skills and talents
- Languages
- Foods
- Fashions
- Music and art
- All interacting with each other to make new things



In biodiversity terms... NYC is:

- A wildflower meadow
- Lots of different types of plant, insect, mammal, bird, fungi... all interacting with each other



Now think of Craggy Island

Not much cultural, linguistic or social diversity!



In biodiversity terms, Craggy Island is:

- Your front lawn
- Very few species no variety
- Not much 'life'






- One major thing in common...

How healthy is Ireland's biodiversity?





Our most precious habitats

 91% of Ireland's protected habitats are 'bad' or 'inadequate'... and it's getting worse (<u>NPWS</u>, 2013)





Figure 1 The Overall assessment results for habitats Figure 3 Trends in assessment results for habitats



Our most precious species

 48% of protected species are 'unfavourable', 'bad' or unknown... and it's not getting much better (NPWS, 2012)



What's causing biodiversity loss?


- Habitat destruction, fragmentation, degradation removing, breaking up or reducing the quality of places where wildlife eats, lives and procreates (44% of the problem)
- Overexploitation using too much (37% of the problem)
- Invasive alien species disrupting the local balance (5%)
- Pollution exceeding or diminishing the carrying capacity of an ecosystem and affecting its ability to function (4%)
- Climate change loading the dice with natural disasters and shifting seasons, plus all of the above (7% of the problem – but much bigger in the coming years)






Biodiversity is the basis of everything





Biodiversity matters for the economy






What can businesses do?

Irish initiatives







- The 3rd National Biodiversity Action Plan
- The All Ireland Pollinator Plan
- The Business Working Responsibly Mark
 - "The existence of policies to manage and continually improve biodiversity;
 - practices that establish objectives and responsibility in this area;
 - the identification of important ecosystem services at local and internal levels;
 - activities to reduce and offset potential adverse impacts;
 - staff, board, customer and supplier awareness-raising activities;
 - the assessment, impact or success of these policies and practices and how this information is fed back into policies and practices;
 - how management demonstrates commitment and leadership in all these areas."

The Biodiversity Framework

What is the Framework?

It is:

- A thinking tool to help a company get started
- Applicable to any company, any sector, any location – there's something for everyone
- Aligned to existing CSR objectives, in CSR 'language'
- Mapped to the Business Working Responsibly Mark
- Integrated with ISO 14001

It isn't:

- A standard or certification
- A unit a company can pick and choose what works best for it
- An end-goal but it can help a company figure out what its endgoal is
- The only option there is an emerging continuum of action on biodiversity and natural capital in the private sector





What are the business benefits?



Improved engagement, morale, productivity, health/wellbeing, staff retention, internal comms



Be seen as leaders in your industry (e.g. give advice to others), keep up with best practice



Better trust and relationships with community and local groups, reduced pressure from NGOs



Better risk mgmt, improved internal processes, regulatory compliance, prep for future legislation



Boost competitive advantage by improving product/service differentiation and winning contractions or clients



Community Focus

Biodiversity in the community





Step 1: Review local biodiversity

- What protected areas and biodiverse habitats are in your locality?
 - SAC / SPA / NHA => check the maps!
 - Who manages them? Who can give you info?
 - Heritage Officers, NPWS Rangers...
 - Is there a local Biodiversity Action Plan? Are there other conservation targets you can support?
 - Are there local NGOs/conservation groups in the area?
 - Are any of your staff involved in these groups?
 - What do they need?
 - Are local schools doing the Biodiversity Green Flag?
- Maintain a record of biodiversity-related activities and identify opportunities for engagement

Step 2: Volunteer and do citizen science

- Use your review to determine where and how you can have the most impact
- NB: Fundraising is great, but don't let that be all you do!
- Explore volunteering and prof skills/pro bono opportunities
 - Ensure to build biodiversity education into all volunteering programmes
- Citizen science initiatives can have huge impact Ireland is very data-poor
 - Can be paired with Lunch & Learn sessions for training
 - Opportunity for enthusiasts on staff to shine



Step 3: Demonstrate local leadership

- Establishing strong community connections will deepen impact
- Co-lead a strategic project to respond to a major biodiversity challenge or opportunity in the locality
 - Focus on protecting a certain species, creating a new habitat, improving the status of an existing habitat, running a public awareness campaign
 - Establish a Steering Group and link in with businesses, community organisations, local authorities, NGOs, etc
 - Facilitate meetings, training or workshops/events at your offices
 - Use your voice to engage the public and media, etc.
