Industry Insights for Teachers
National Evaluation Report 2022-23



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1.0 Introduction

Business in the Community Ireland (BITCI) is the network for responsible and sustainable business. Our purpose is to inspire and enable businesses to bring about a sustainable, low carbon economy and a more inclusive society where everyone thrives. One of our flagship social inclusion supports is the Schools' Business Partnership (SBP) which has been in place supporting Government for the past twenty years. Within the SBP suite of programmes is a teacher support programme, Industry Insights for Teachers (IIT), which brings together post primary school subject teachers and guidance counsellors with representatives from all levels, and across all sectors, of industry and business in Ireland.

Industry Insights for Teachers seeks to:

- O Support greater engagement between industry and education, adding value to education professions and advancing a culture of industry collaboration.
- O Provide teachers and guidance counsellors with insight into fast developing industries and new sectors, such as renewable energy.
- o Inform educators on the technical and professional qualifications, as well as employability skills, that are needed now and in the near future to address skills gaps.
- O Showcase the different routes into roles and sectors, such as new apprenticeships.
- o Highlight fast-evolving career opportunities across the country, not just in our cities.
- o Expose educators to the optimism and appetite for industry and career development across all sectors and regions.

During the 2022-23 academic year, 18 IIT sessions took place across the country with businesses based in all regions. Sessions were held online and in person, to maximise accessibility and bring educators into fast evolving workplaces and production sites and responded to Department of Education requests for a broad geographic spread. The selection of sectors was informed by teachers' demands and reflected a wide variety of industries from STEM to hospitality. Apprenticeships were also highlighted and collaborations were formed with bodies such as Fast Track to IT (FIT) to promote IT apprenticeships for both students and employers. This year was the first year that BITCI collaborated with our counterpart in Northern Ireland, BITCNI, to deliver a cross-border IIT session with Veolia. Welcoming the initiative, Minister Norma Foley said:

This is an important collaboration between industry and schools, on the island of Ireland. We live in a modern, ever-changing, global marketplace and it is important that our students receive a 21st century education that embeds them with the tools to remain competitive in this global marketplace. It's essential that our teachers and guidance counsellors know how business is evolving and what skills today's students will need to succeed in their careers. The department is pleased to be able to support this type of collaboration.

Every IIT session has been evaluated and we took on bord the gaps in teachers' knowledge, and their requests for information on regional distribution, and sectors and businesses to be featured in our planning for the 2023-24 academic year.

2.0 Evaluation Trends

The main findings from the 2022/23 session evaluations are below (with the response from 2021/22 national evaluation indicated in brackets after this year's figure):

- **97%** (99%) of teachers found the session very useful or useful
- 93% (91%) rated the delivery either excellent or very good
- 98% (95%) rated the session content as either excellent or very good
- 96% (90%) of teachers would definitely recommend the series to other teachers

Over **300** teachers and career guidance counsellors attended these **18** sessions throughout 2022-23 with an average session attendance of just under **17** attendees per session.

The sessions often inspired teachers to reach out to business to harness the possibilities that they presented:

It's essential for educators to connect employers, it should be seamless and part of the secondary school cycle - interesting its business that are leading with this.

4.0 Teacher Feedback

After each IIT session, participants complete a survey asking about the following areas:

- The value of the material and information presented
- The relevance of the content
- The suitability of the format
- Whether this is a programme they would recommend to another teacher.

Both qualitative and quantitative responses are sought, including providing ratings and commentary. The below is a sample of the narrative comments and responses provided by teachers/ career guidance counsellors.

Enjoyed learning about Abbvie and Charles River. Aim to contact these companies to discuss TY Opportunities

North West: Abbvie, Charles River Laboratories, Insurance Institue Ireland, ATU, STEM and apprenticeships

Demystified the idea that apprenticeships are plumbers and carpenters who don't do a 'good' leavingcert.

Cork: Apprenticeships with Bus Eireann, FIT, and Aviva

Invaluable in terms of understanding the different careers available within the pharmaceutical industry and the progression opportunities available from different qualifications.

Kerry: Astellas pharmaceuticals

It gave me more information for my students both on the career (and the diversity therein) and the entry paths. It was great to hear from Hannah as somebody who is just in the door.

Dublin area: Aviva and Insurance Institute, apprenticeships

Exactly the real world information that teachers need to know

Donegal: Bus Eireann and Inishowen Engineering, apprenticeships & STEM

Good to see Deloitte taking staff from all career and education backgrounds as this is vital. We are a DEIS school so any encouragement towards careers and not social welfare is essential.

Getting an insight into this industry and the roles was really helpful for me to understand this growing area which I hear about in the news daily, but I don't necessarily understand the different career paths.

Munster: Veolia, environmental management

It was really practical and useful information that we can pass on to our students, this is something you don't necessarily learn through school based CPD or through guidance counsellor training etc.

Dublin: Workday, business and tech consultancy
